A Critical Moment in America's Worldview



1. The Death of Modernity – the death of the positive dynamic of the Enlightenment has been in process since the mid 1960ies
2. The Rise of Post modernity – the impact of the new worldview taking over the soul of America
3. The Present Crisis: economic, killing, same sex unions, terrorism, shifts in centers of power and religion

The Patristic Balance

4th to 17th Century



1. Transcendence takes precedence over immanence...
2. Grace takes precedence over nature...
3. Authority in the Scripture as interpreted by the church...
4. Reflected in the art, music, literature and architecture...

The Enlightenment: 17th to the Middle of the 20th Century



1. Immanence takes precedence over transcendence...
2. Light of reason dethroned the church as the source of authority...
3. Revolution in philosophy - Bacon, Descartes, Kant...
4. Revolution in science - Aristotle overturned, Copernicus, Galileo, Newton...

10. Age of capitalism/consumerism

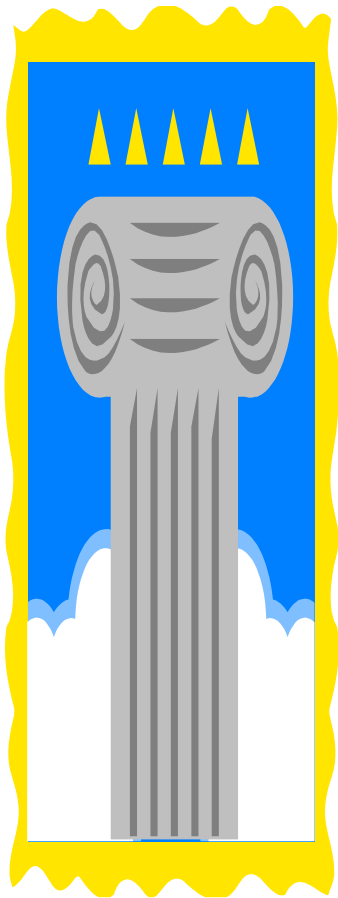
Postmodernism

Early 1960's to the Present

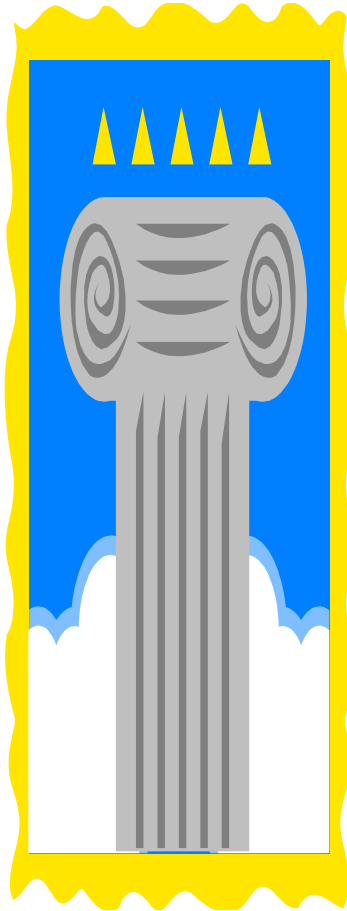


1. Universe Not Self-Contained *

7. Limited Autonomy/Process

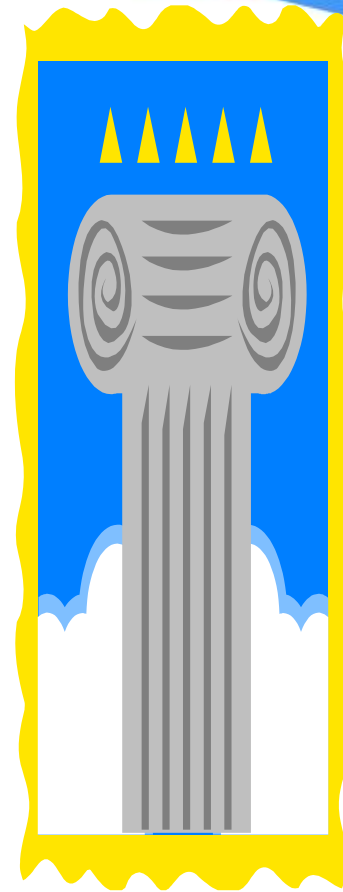

Foundationalism

3. The probabilistic outcome of induction...

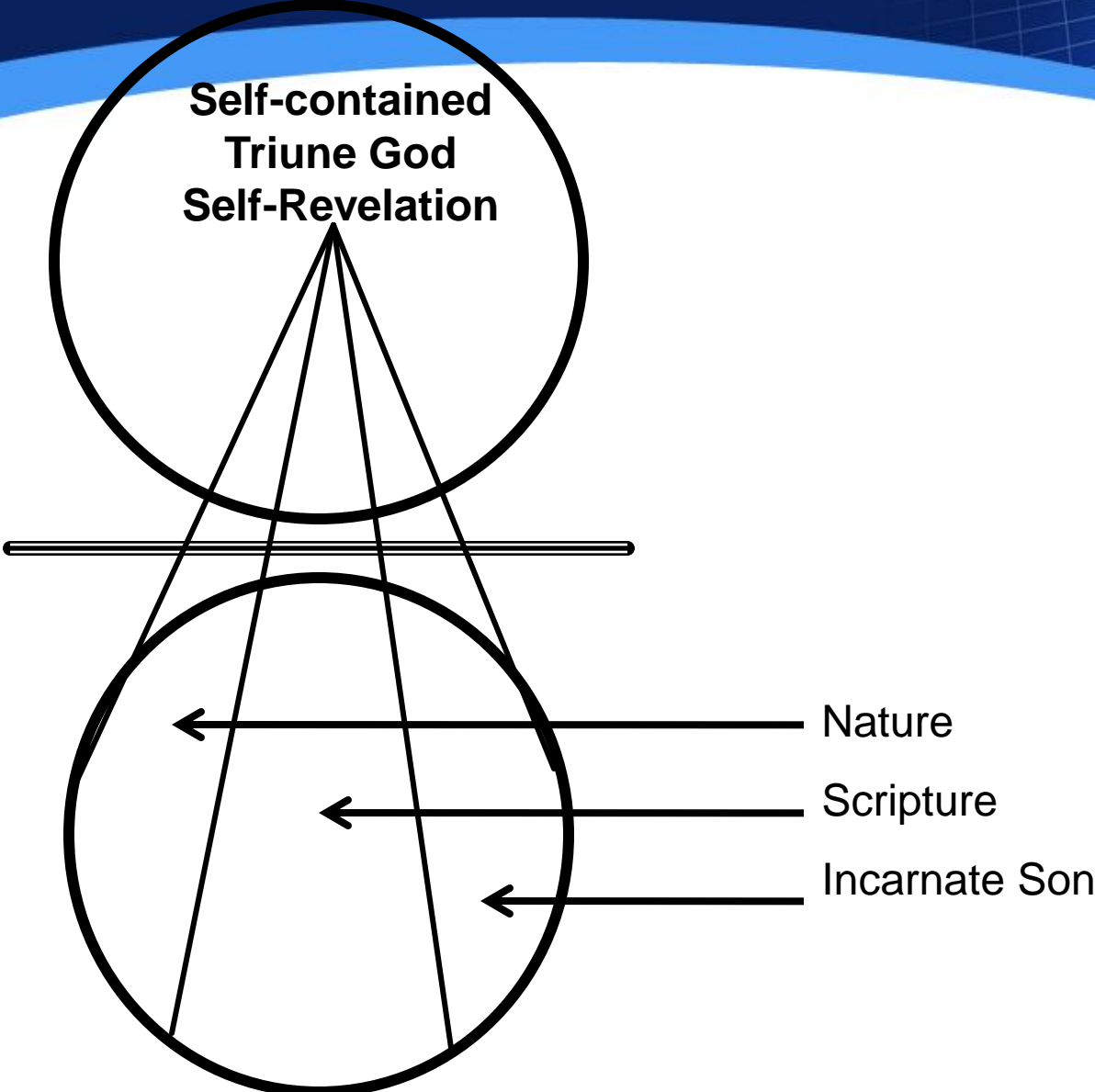
Epistemic Justification

1. The manner in which our web of beliefs are related to each other...
2. Logical consistency...
3. Relationship of concurrence...
4. Explanatory power...

A Biblical Epistemology



The Noetic Structure



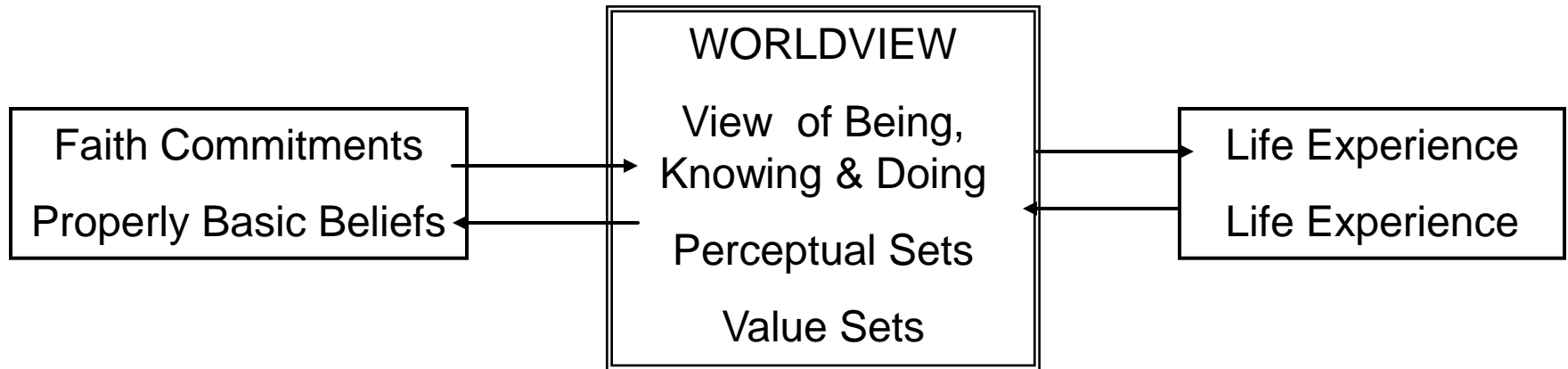
1. The sum total of what a person believes
2. Beliefs are related and not random
3. Beliefs are held with differing degrees of certainty
4. Beliefs differ with regard to the influence or control they have over the rest of the beliefs in the structure

Properly Basic Beliefs



1. Held with the strongest possible conviction
2. Have the greatest degree of ingression possible
3. Have the highest degree of control over the other beliefs in the noetic structure

Function of a Worldview



Ground of Certainty



1. *Certainty* – a firm or positive belief in something...
2. *Assurance* – a belief in something for which we have confidence...
3. *Confidence* – a belief we have about something but it lacks being positive...
4. *Security* – guarantees freedom from doubt...
5. *True Beyond Reasonable Doubt*...
